The LRF achieved exciting accomplishments in 2018. In our Champa Ban Youth Rugby work, the LRF expanded to 7 new districts in Laos, hosted 71 competitions and delivered 2278 rugby and life skills sessions. In our club rugby work, the LRF welcomed a new club, Xieng Khouang Rugby Football Club as full members of the LRF and hosted 14 competitions including the first U14 club competition with 8 participating Lao teams and 2 visiting teams. In our elite rugby programming, we earned 9 international victories including over Brunei, Nepal, Guam and Indonesia.





A final remarkable achievement the LRF celebrated in 2018 was Ms. Lao Khang, the LRF's Xieng Khouang Rugby Development Coordinator being named one of BBC's 100 Women of 2018. Lao Khang became the first Lao recipient of the award recognising her years of work to grow the sport of rugby in Xieng Khouang, especially for female players and coaches in rural areas.

# Elite Rugby lao representative teams

The DAC Lao U18 Nagas Men's teams participated in the Bangkok International Rugby 7s from 10-11 November and recorded a 3rd place finish.

The DAC Lao Nagas Women's team finished as Runners Up in the Singapore Life Girls Rugby TRC Cup.

The DAC Lao Nagas teams took the pitch in the Lai Si Construction Kowloon RugbyFest (with the Women's team winning the Plate) before playing an exhibition match at the GFI Hong Kong Football Club 10s.

At the elite level, the Lao National Men's and Women's teams recorded 9 international victories and scored 37 international tries between them in a successful year on the pitch.

The Lao Women's National Team recorded a record finish in Brunei in the 2018 Asia Rugby 7s Trophy,

coming in as Plate Runners Up after winning four matches out of six (including producing some major tournament upsets).

The DAC Lao U18 Women's National 7s Team - under the guidance of World Rugby Level 2 Coaches, Boudsadee 'Vaen' Vongdala and Lao Khang - won the Bowl Trophy at the Asia Rugby U18 7s held in India. The team recorded wins against Bangladesh, Nepal and Chinese Taipei.

The DAC Lao Men's National Team participated in the Asia 7s Trophy in Singapore. With the team in a transition phase, it was a tough campaign, yet finished with a strong victory against Nepal.

The DAC U18 Lao Men's National Team participated in the Asia Rugby U18s 7s in Malaysia from the 8-9 December.

# Challenges ELITE RUGBY

Lack of consistent coaching support; Men's National Team currently in transition; Limited structured rehabilitation processes in place for injuries.

### **CLUB RUGBY**

Limited pitch access and availability; Lack of regular competitive fixtures; Limited structured coaching support; Player numbers and cost limits 15-a-side competitions; High cost of overseas travel limits international club competition.

### **ADMINISTRATION**

Expansion into new districts resulting in overstretched staff members; Limited funding available; Clashing events and competition dates result in strained staff.

### **CHAMPA BAN YOUTH RUGBY**

Limited availability of suitable pitches for contact rugby; Competing budget priorities restrict opportunities for development;

Safety concerns from community leaders around contact rugby.
